

# Nuts and Bolts (or Miscellaneous Tidbits)

Happy New Year to everyone!

I hope everyone is managing to keep warm this winter. Did you know that it was so cold in the winter of 1932 that Niagara Falls froze completely solid? How would you have liked to have been riding in a rumble seat during that winter? Did the end of the Model A Ford era cause this incredible freezing phenomenon? One wonders!! One also wonders whether Mr. Bell, who designed one of our first fighter jets in 1942, might have borrowed an idea from Henry Ford. Bell's new XP59 jet fighter had an enclosed cockpit with a single seat for the pilot. During the extensive flight-testing, it proved too demanding for the test pilot to fly the various jet flight parameters while also recording all the important technical flight data. Therefore, an extra seat similar to the open-air rumble seat was incorporated but placed in front of the pilot in the nose section where a technician could ride and record the data. The front seat only had a small windscreen and no canopy. Can you just imagine how cold this guy must have been at those jet speeds, sitting in the open and trying to record data?

I just heard from a close friend of ours in Kansas City about a bad accident up there on Christmas Eve. Four people were injured, one critically, when a 1929 Model A Ford kit car veered off the road, struck a light pole and rolled onto its top. The driver, a 65-year-old Overland Park man, and two of his passengers, his 43-year-old daughter-in-law and 17-year-old granddaughter, suffered serious injuries. The granddaughter's friend, a 17-year-old boy, was ejected from the car and suffered life-threatening injuries. This is very sad news and we wish those injured our very best in their recoveries. However, this is a good reminder as we move into a new year that we always need to keep *Safety* in mind as we drive our old cars. If you have installed seat belts, please use them. Let's keep our cars in good shape, watch out and help one another. Let's all have a fun and safe year driving our Model A Fords during 2011.

# 1929 Model A Ford Pickup Roadster by Ken Brust

I have driven along Sheridan past the Oklahoma Technical College on numerous occasions and have seen an antique pickup truck parked in its showroomlobby. Curious, I recently stopped to learn more about this



vehicle. The owner is Ivan Acosta. Ivan and his wife founded Community Care College almost 16 years ago. This college offers various diploma and associate degree programs in allied health, business, education, legal and several others. Oklahoma Technical College and Clary Sage College are branch campuses. OTC offers courses in automotive, barbering and welding and Clary Sage has courses in Cosmetology, Interior Design and Fashion Design.

All locations are state licensed, nationally accredited and recognized by the United States Department of Education. Ivan told me: "My wife and I are both vehicle enthusiasts so opening an automotive technology training school was an easy decision. It's been fun surrounding ourselves (our students and our instructors)

with others that love cars. When we saw the truck, we knew that it would be a great fit for our lobby." The 1929 Model A Ford Pickup Roadster was purchased locally from a friend of Ivan's in Broken Arrow who had previously purchased it from someone in Iowa. The restoration was performed in Iowa but Ivan does not know who did it. The truck has a Corvair front-end suspension, a Chevy 231 V6 a 350 Turbo Hydramatic Transmission and a Camaro rear end. The front fenders are original but the rear ones are aftermarket. If you are in the neighborhood of South Sheridan, stop and check out this pretty little truck Roadster. 

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



# CLUTCH STICKING PROBLEMS WHEN STORING YOUR CAR

The best way to prevent clutches from sticking is to drive our cars all year. The Tulsa Club does a nice job of having activities and driving events almost every month of the year. However, if you need to store your car for the winter Les Andrews has some advice for you.

The Model A clutch will collect moisture when stored in a humid area for the winter or any long period of time. Storage should be in a dry area. Covering it with a tarp outside makes it worse because it traps the moisture and condensation. The result is the clutch rusts to the Flywheel (there are metal particles in the clutch disk). The only way to get it loose is to pull the engine and remove the pressure plate and clutch. This usually means replacing the clutch plate. Start the car once a week during the winter months and activate the clutch a few times. Spinning the flywheel will eliminate most condensation buildup.

# Accident Created Development of Safety Glass in Model A

Competition and safety factors forced Henry Ford to make changes to the Model T. When those changes came in the form of the Model A, they were extensive. Where the Model T transmission was a two-speed, pedal- operated planetary system, its successor utilized a three-speed, lever-operated sliding gear unit complete with a clutch. The ignition on the Model T used a magneto operating off the flywheel, while the Model A used a Kettering-type battery-and-coil system. Four wheel brakes were also featured on the new car, as was a water pump to circulate coolant through the engine. Previous Ford engines depended on the thermosyphon phenomena to circulate their coolant.

The need for one modern safety feature in his new car was demonstrated very pointedly to Henry Ford during a preproduction road test. Harold Hicks, a Ford powertrain engineer who had been instrumental in improving the embryonic Model A engine, crashed a test car and was pitched through the plate glass windshield. Hicks sustained heavy injuries to one arm, and as a result of this, the Model A Ford carried safety glass from the day it was offered to the public
