OSU OKMULGEE, THURSDAY NOVEMBER 17 CULINARY ARTS DEPARTMENT'S BUFFET



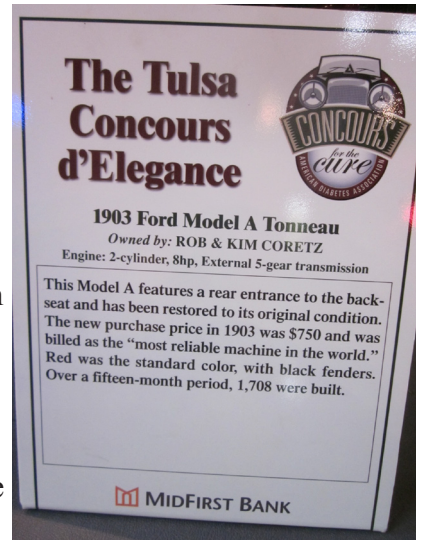
