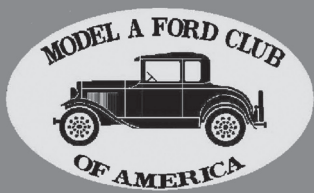

President's Message

Wow -- what a difference a week makes. Last week at Tom Mix Days we were had a heat index of 100+ and on this bright Monday morning it is 46. However, Henry build our cars to take whatever weather Mother Nature threw at the Grand Ladies -- well that be a bit of a stretch but close.

As a reminder, the nominating process for Board of Director is in process. These terms will serve for 2011 and 2012. We have three members (Ken Brust, Harold Helton, and Virginia Helton) with terms expiring in 2010. All three have indicated they do not wish to be a candidate this cycle. The Board has assembled a Nominating Committee of Ken Brust (Chairman), Connie Hudson, and Benny Benson. At the October membership meeting

Ken will present the Nominating Committee's slate of candidates to the membership as well as ask for nominations from the floor. Once the slate of candidates has been finalized following the membership meeting the members will vote on the candidates at the November membership meeting (Friday, November 12 at the Chili Dinner/Auction). MAFCA requires us to have at least five members of the Board be members of the national organization. We encourage all those interested in being on the Board of Directors to contact any of the members of the Nominating Committee. This is a great opportunity to take a leadership role in the Club.

The Board has been discussing ways to prepare for the 2014 Regional meet in Tulsa. One of those items discussed pertains to creating an upfront financial fund allocated specifically to support this event. After considerable discussion the Board unanimously agreed to "set aside" \$2,000 of our

current bank balance to create a support fund for this event. The Board further agreed to add \$1,000 minimum in 2011 and 2012 to this fund. This would give \$4,000+ total by 2012. If further funds are needed we would still have 2013 to make our final financial preparations. We understand these funds will be returned to the Club treasury at the conclusion of the Regional meet assuming a successful meet. The Board further agreed to start the planning process in 2011 by first having a "brain storming" or "idea creation" session that could be used by the future Planning Committee.

Reminder, we will be updating the Directory for 2011. Thank you to those who have submitted your revised information. If the information in the current Directory is not correct please send the correct information to Tulsa Model A Ford Club, P.O. Box 691524, Tulsa, OK 74169. TECHNICAL TIPS/DISCUSSION:

Front Wheel Bearing Adjustment

Les Andrews says that “loose” is better than too tight for the front wheel bearings. You can always tighten a new bearing a little more snug than you can a used bearing. Because of the small diameter of the outer bearing, it is spinning at a very high rpm and have seen many heat and weld itself to the spindle before you can stop the car. You should always replace the bearings and races at the same time. With a new set I snug the axle nut down pretty good then back it off to the first castle position on the nut. If just re tightening the front wheel bearing that has been on the car a while, tighten the axle nut just enough to bring the bearing and race together and then back off to first castle position on the nut. In all cases make sure the wheel spins free. New bearings and races can be a little tighter. They will seat in and loosen some after a few miles. -- Les Andrews
