

In addition she served on the


Regional Planning committee and hosted meetings at her workplace. Connie is recognized in the January/ February Restorer on page 43.

AWESOME APRICOT BARS

CRUST

1 cup all purpose flour

1/4 t salt

6 T butter

1 T water

- 1. In medium bowl combine flour and salt. With pastry blender, cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs...
- 2. Sprinkle in water, tossing with a fork until pastry is just moist enough to hold together.
- 3. Press into 8 inch square pan. Refrigerate 15 minutes. Put in a preheated 400 deg. oven and bake for 15 minutes.

APRICOT LAYER

Mix together: 1 cup (about 6 ounces) dried apricots,,

1/4 c. water,

1/4 to 1/2 c. Disaronno amarettto,

1/3 c. water

ALMOND LAYER

1/2 c. butter, softened

1/2 c. sugar

2 eggs

1/4 c. all purpose flour

1 c. (about 4 ozs) ground blanched almonds

1 t. vanilla extract

1/8 t. almond extract

ICING

1 T. softened butter

1/2 t. vanilla extract


1 T. milk

1 t. amaretto

Enough powdered sugar to make thin icing

- 1. APRICOT LAYER: In small saucepan combine the above 4 ingredients.Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and cook about 15 minutes or until soft and can be mashed with a fork. Cool
- 2. ALMOND LAYER: In mixing bowl cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time and beat until mixed. Add flour, almonds and extracts.
- 3. Reduce oven to 350 degrees. Spread apricot mixture evenly over pastry. Smooth with a spatula. Bake 30 35 minutes. Cool in pan. Drizzle with icing and sprinkle with sliced almonds. Cut in small squares.

Note: Can use cranberries but will need to add more sugar. Will freeze for up to 3 months
