
### THE FINER POINTS

Have you been driving your motor as much as me? Last year, I barely made it past the 1,000 miles mark. So, I've been making an effort to drive as much as possible. I cannot let my parents have more miles than me again!







It is an original radiator mounting pad. Have you ever ordered a new set from the parts book, and then had issues getting everything to mount back up? If so, it may be due to the hole for the bolt not being off-center. If the hole is not in the correct place, I have found the pad will be forced down between the front crossmember and the radiator splash shield. This can cause alignment issues when trying to put the car back together.

Originally, the mounting pads were approximately 1-3/4" x 1-1/4" and 5/32" thick. They were made of either oak tanned leather or fabric reinforced rubber like the body pads. The example above is the leather version. It lasted pretty well for 90 plus years, right?







Thanks to Don, Marilyn, Chuck and Karen of the Sooner Club for planning and hosting such an interesting Spring Tour down Lawton way, where the buffalo and longhorns roam, prairie dogs play, tornadoes threaten, artillery boom, Geronimo rests and the Model A Fords continue to merrily roll along. 


