THE FINER POINTS

We're definitely in the middle of wonderful golden summer days. Perfect weather for sorting through parts, right? It seems like I find something new every time I go looking through stuff. Does that happen to everyone, or just me? Recently, I ran across the below. These are NOS fender braces: one for a Coupe and one for a Sedan.

Below is a photo of the reinforcement bracket that is meant to be used with the above brackets. This is on an NOS early 1928 fender.

Interestingly, I believe Ford may have built up a stock of the early design fender braces that took them longer than two months to work through. The below photo is the fender brace used on my original and unrestored Roadster. As you can see, the early style fender brace is clearly used with the second style fender reinforcement bracket



On an original car, I can probably get by with something being slightly out of date. At least I hope so since I'm taking my original Roadster to the MARC National in July. Wish me luck that it does well!



At first glance, they look like normal fender braces for '28-early '29. However, when you look more closely you can tell they are first generation braces. This is evidenced by the raised boss on the end that would go next to the fender. This mates with the first generation fender reinforcement bracket.



So, what other distinguishing features can be found on early 1928 fenders? Below is a photo of the "scalloped" edge on a fender which the standards states were used through August of 1928.

However, I believe these were in use longer than stated in the Standards because my original Roadster, original Phaeton, Dad's Henry Winning Roadster all have the scalloped design.




