### THE FINER POINTS

Wow! We have certainly had a lot more snow than I expected so far this year! I'm looking forward to slightly warmer days ahead. Maybe if I'm lucky, I can start to remove side curtains soon. Since I have been spending more time inside, I have been looking at some of the literature I have collected over the years. Recently, I have been interested in dealer literature.


I started out collecting magazine advertisements several years ago when our friend, Don House, moved away. So, if my wife is looking for someone to blame for all this madness, she now has a name! Ha! Most magazine ads are fairly common since so many were produced. There are a few rare ones like my "New Ford De Luxe Phaeton" ad from 1930. It's a very popular one that was only printed once on the inside back cover of a magazine, which is why it's so rare today. In my opinion, it's one of the best graphics ever made for a Model "A" advertisement.



Lately, I have been on the lookout for dealer literature in addition to regular advertisements. Recently, I found the below pamphlet that would have

been available in Ford dealers. Unfortunately, we do not know the exact date this booklet was produced, but we can narrow it down to either late 1930 or early 1931 due to the inclusion of the Victoria Coupe and the exclusion of the Convertible Sedan (400-A). Dealer literature that includes the 400-A is extremely rare.

It is not very large, but it has lots of great information on the back. Most of the time when prices for Model "A" Fords are listed, they are F.O.B. Detroit. However, these prices include shipping to McDonough, Georgia. The Ford F.O.B. Detroit price for a Victoria Coupe was \$580, but the cash delivered price to Georgia was \$100.50 more. Seems like a large markup! Also interesting to



me is the 12-month financing terms with an imputed interest rate of 21%!

At left is an original pricing tag that would have been tied to the mirror of the car for easy visibility. As you can see, there were different terms available through Ford's Credit Arm, but none as long as the five or more years available today. On a side note, I believe these have been reproduced to some extent. So, you might be able to find one to fill out for your car at a swap meet.

However, the mirror may have been too far away for some dealers' customers because Ford also made the tag at right that would wrap around the headlight bar. Made from the same material used on cowl panels, this one is my personal favorite.



So next time you're at a swap meet, be sure to keep an eye out for dealer literature. It's definitely unique! Perhaps in a future issue, I'll give you a glimpse into the dealer albums I've found.




